The North University Neighborhood Association (NUNA), as a neighborhood in Sector One (a planning area of Austin), has been participating in the monthly Sector One Council meetings. Sector One is bounded by Lamar/Guadalupe, 51st Street, IH-35 and Town Lake. It was organized in January of 1985.

The Sector Council is a link between the neighborhoods in Sector One; between the neighborhoods and City Departments, such is the Finance Department; and between the Sector Council participants and the City's Department of Planning and Growth Management for Austin's Comprehensive Plan: Austinplan.

Susanne Cannon, of the Original City
Neighborhood, was recently elected Chair
of Sector One. Mike McHone, of Save University Neighborhoods, was the first Chair
of Sector One. Mike and two other Sector
One participants (Pert Cromack of Hyde
Park and Natalie deBlois of Heritage
Neighborhood) are now members of the Comprehensive Plan Steering Committee.

The March Sector One meeting was devoted to Recreation/Open Space issues. The neighborhoods discussed their responses to a questionnaire and mapped their concerns. Representatives from the Parks & Recreation Department and from the Office of Land Development Services attended the meeting to talk about funding and planning for future recreation needs.

The subject of the next Sector meeting will be transportation issues.

Q. How can I get a schedule for the bus in my area?

A. Capital Metro bus schedules are displayed at more than 100 locations throughout the Austin area, including public libraries and many state office buildings. But the most convenient way to get a specific schedule is to call Capital Metro's Customer Information Center at 474-1200 . . . we'll be glad to send you one in the mail.

Q. What can I do if I experience a problem on the bus?

A. Even though we have supervisors on the road at all times, quite often the best source of information regarding our service is our customers. If you experience a problem with any of Capital Metro's services, please call the Passenger Assistance Department at 385-0190. We will make every effort to investigate the problem and provide you with a prompt reply.

Q. How can I tell what route a bus is serving when I am standing at a bus stop?

A. Each bus is equipped with a destination sign, mounted above the windshield. This sign displays the number and name of the route currently being served. Some buses also have a smaller version of this sign on the side, near the door. Also, buses display additional destination information in the lower left corner of the windshield. In the future, some bus stop signs also will list bus routes served at that location.
